

Volunteers whose posts are on the west side of the Willamette River should be at their posts no later than 6:30 AM. Volunteers positioned on the east side should be at their posts no later than 6:45 AM. Those traveling into or through Downtown to get to their posts should plan for extra travel time. Upon arriving at your post, please do NOT park your vehicle on any road that will be used for the race route; park at least one block away.

Upon arriving at your post, search nearby street corners to find the barricades that have been left out for your use. In some cases you may need to walk down the street or to the next corner to find the barricades. Be prepared to place the barricades in the road when law enforcement or PBOT personnel direct you to do so.

If your post is near a TriMet train or bus crossing, a TriMet official will be nearby. Follow their directions at all times, and note that in some cases it will be necessary to move your barricades to allow a bus or train to pass through your post if directed to do so.

The black arrow in the drawing below represents the route taken by the RUNNERS, not vehicles. Your task is to prevent any vehicles from accessing the road used by the runners, with the exception of certain TriMet vehicles, police officers, and Race Management staff.

You may direct the public to visit portlandmarathon.com/traffic to find information on traffic control during the race.

Please do not leave your post during the race unless another person arrives to take over the position. This includes brief breaks, bathroom needs, etc.


Once the last runner has passed your location, do not remove the barricades until directed to do so. Once directed, please place all of your barricades in a group on a nearby street corner out of the traffic lane.

Before you leave the safety of the sidewalk, look carefully for moving vehicles. You have no physical or legal protection in the street. Your role is advisory; persuasive advisory at the most. Only commissioned Police Officers can require specific action of a motorist. Persuasion is an art and dealing with the motoring public is an experience that will challenge your ability to communicate constructively.



Flaggers:

- Cone off center lane of SE 28th Ave between SE Botsford Dr and SE Woodstock Blvd to divide runners on the east side and vehicles on the west side.
- Flag vehicles north and south through the west lane.
- Watch for traffic coming out of SE Moreland Ln. Flag vehicles out of that street and allow local access only back in.
- Do not allow vehicles on the east lane during the event.
- Do not leave post until released by police.
